IN OFFICE VIVAER® PRE-OP INSTRUCTIONS

MEDICATIONS

PRESCRIPTIONS

- Pain medication (NORCO)
- Anti-anxiety (VALIUM)
- Anti-nausea (ZOFRAN)
- Ointment (MÙPIROCIŃ)

OVER THE COUNTER MEDIĆINE

- Afrin Nasal Spray
- Saline Nasal Spray

THE DAY BEFORE

- Complete your pre-op phone call with our office for instructions and time of arriva
- The Norco, Valium, Zofran, and Mupirocin will be called in to your pharmacy.
- Trim excessive nose hair.

THE DAY OF PROCEDURE

90 MINUTES PRIOR TO ARRIVAL TIME

• TAKE ____ VALIUM AND ____ NORCO (quantity given during pre-op call)

60 MINUTES PRIOR TO ARRIVAL TIME

• 4 SPRAYS OF AFRIN TO EACH SIDE OF NOSE

BRING ALL OF THESE MEDICATIONS WITH YOU TO YOUR APPOINTMENT AND MAKE SURE YOU HAVE A DESIGNATED DRIVER.

Dress comfortably in something you wouldn't mind getting blood on as you may have some bleeding. We keep the procedure room cold so bringing a blanket is suggested if you get cold easily. You can expect to be at our office for a minimum of 1 hour. You are allowed ONE guest in the room with you during the numbing process but once the procedure begins, they must wait in the waiting room and will be notified when the procedure is complete.



POST-OP IN OFFICE VIVAER® INSTRUCTIONS

After your procedure:

- Wait 30-60 minutes before eating or drinking anything after the procedure. First take small sips of water to make sure your throat is no longer numb. You may eat a light lunch/dinner, and relax for the remainder of the day while the medications wear off. You may resume regular diet the next day.
- Common side effects include temporary inflammation, tenderness, and crusting at the treatment site.
- It is recommended that you don't blow your nose for the first week after treatment.
- Do not pinch or manipulate the treatment area for one week after the procedure.
- Rinse your nose at least twice a day with saline for 2 weeks unless instructed otherwise.
- Apply ointment to the inside of your nose for one week after the procedure.
- In general, as with any nasal treatment, you may experience increased sensitivity, congestion, and/or pain during the healing process. You may use the prescribed pain medication as needed.
- You may experience a small amount of occasional nasal bleeding over the next few days which is normal. Call our office if bleeding lasts longer that 15 minutes.
- Schedule a follow-up appointment for 2-4 weeks.
- If you have severe nausea or headaches, heavy uncontrollable nosebleeds, or have other questions about your recovery, please call our office. A phone number is listed on our answering machine that will get you in touch with the physician on call if after hours.
